A Message from the Zion Lutheran Council President:



Important information:

- -Roundtable meeting included updates on the current status with the developers and WHEDA, potential plan B options, progress made by Carrie Sanders on the Zion financial assessment.
- -Parsonage was rented and fsm. (Fabricating Something More) moved in on November 1, 2024.
- -Zion Place will be undergoing some changes as their current managers are retiring August 2025.
- -Bonnie completed the final report for the 2023 Community Vision Fund grant we received. These funds paid for the community assessment and feasibility work done by Generative Local Community Institute (GLCI) and shared in their final report to Zion. It also covered funding Bonnie's position as Project Manager for the bulk of the year.
- -Bonnie submitted Zion's application for the upcoming Year-End Matching Gift Campaign sponsored by the Community Foundation.
- -Bonnie attended the fourth session of Appleton Town Makers.
- -Zion's potential developer has decided not to advance the Zion Affordable Housing project to WHEDA.
