Parish Administrator's Report:



Karen present and gave an oral report, Snow removal company Lector will take care for Zion. For the future looking at splitting expense with Zion Homes which is taken care of by Arnie. The printer in the office needs to be replaced. Karen checked into a couple of contracts with companies and Rhyme is the cheapest at \$199. A motion made and approved to get new printer and contract. Looking into the old printer being serviced by the new company and keeping it to use for renters to come. Balancing accounts -dedicated accounts- move interest into cash control – investment. Vicar Jake is looking for support on a draft for response of concern to AASD school board about safeguarding students to Edison and communication. A motion was made and approved. Meetings:

January 12, 2025 Zion Leadership met with Carrie Sanders of Hope Community Capital

Important information:

-Community Foundation's Year-End Matchin program yielded an additional \$1450 toward Zion's work in creating affordable housing

-Questions about WHEDA's New Guidelines clarified; First, its highly unlikely an appeal of any sort would produce appreciable results due to the nature of the competitive funding process. Second, there are some advantages to proceeding without the competitive funding, including less restriction on what can be built/created.

-Bonnie met with people spearheading an effort to create housing for adult loved ones with disabilities. -Bonnie attended the Housing coalition meeting via Zoom, had a coffee date with some of the people doing smaller developments in the Appleton area, and a coffee date with a staff member of Pillars who is wellversed in supportive housing.

-Roundtable meeting was cancelled due to weather. To Be Rescheduled.

-Bonnie met with Harriet Redman and Dave Porterfield to hear from Dave with regard to building supportive housing as he has been in that field for over 30 years.

-Bonnie participated in the Partners for Places informational webinar sponsored by The Funders Network. -Bonnie met with Maiyoua Thao for Long Chen.

-Bonnie had a phone call with Carrie Sanders from Hope Community Capital with regards to next steps for Zion housing project.
