

On the Affordable Housing Project, I can say that the selection committee has been working diligently and on August 27th had a very productive meeting with a potential developer. Many of our questions and concerns were addressed. Therefore, there is a tentative timeline. The selection committee would like to present the pertinent information concerning this proposal to the congregation on Sunday, September 8th. There will then be a two week period for members to consider the proposal with a congregational meeting scheduled for Sunday, September 22nd in order to vote. Mark these dates on your calendars because it is essential we have a plan in place for replacing the income we receive from the Appleton Bilingual School when they leave as of August 31, 2025.

Please keep the selection committee and Zion's future in your prayers as we move forward. In the 15th chapter of John's gospel, God tells us, "I am the vine and you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit." To paraphrase from Matthew's gospel, "I was without shelter and you provided me a home". Through this housing project we can bear good fruit for Zion and the greater community.

### The Vicar's Views

One of my favorite Christian music artists is Amy Grant, who popularized the Scripture verse from Psalm 119: 105 in the song: "Thy Word". Take a few minutes and find the song online and be inspired by the words. The first verse of this song is especially meaningful: "Think I've lost my way; Still you're there right beside me; And nothing will I fear; As long as you are near; Please be near me to the end".



The main point that I want to share with you this month as we start Sunday School, Confirmation class and hopefully, Adult Bible Study, is the importance of turning to God's Word as a source of guidance and strength in our lives. Scripture is central in the curriculum this year for our children and hopefully it is central in your prayer life. My hope and prayer for all of us is that we will turn to scripture as a way to grow in our faith, be inspired and receive the strength and light we need for our spiritual journey.

Parish Administrator's Report: Hand out – New Voices a group who had interest in renting out the Parish House has decided not to rent it out. Letters have gone out to nonprofits about renting out the Parish House. AASD is back up to date with payments to the church. The issue was not receiving invoices from Lambert Services. Vicar Jake is set up in the Parish House for now with his office. Karen will be taking a full-time position with another job and her hours will be reduced from 20 to 10 hours however she will fully be able to assist Zion with all our needs!

There was a discussion about the doors on Commercial St. being locked going forward on Sundays. The 6 people who usually use those doors to do fellowship have keys to get into the church. No concerns currently just thinking of safety for all. This matter will be sent to the property committee for further consideration.

Job proposal: Hospitality and Entertainment Coordinator, 20 hours a month, working with activities such as Outreach Participation, Advent, Lent, Christmas in July, etc. Paid position that would come from designated funds that are not being used. A job description was designed, and Personnel will review and meet. If approved by them it will be posted in bulletin and social network on how to apply if interested. Looking for someone with organization skills, skilled set, some heavy lifting involved, and a people person.

# **Affordable Housing Project Update**

#### Important information:

- The Zion Selection Committee met several times to go over questions about the proposal from the potential developers. The main takeaways from their answers were that they do intend to raze the parsonage to build a new building, they offered their sense of the pros and cons of doing the whole process at once versus in phases, they clarified that they also see the value in integrating the affordable units with the market rate units, they moved Zion further along in an understanding of how a partnership would work, and they shared a typical funding mix for getting a project like this one done. They also did reply that they felt adding small businesses to the build would be complicated from a design/accessibility perspective and also from a financial feasibility perspective.
- The Selection Team discussed it being time to engage with both an attorney and a CPA well-versed in these types of projects.
- -Don Bernards, along with Jon Armstrong of SVA and Carrie Sanders from Hope Community Capital are willing to work with Zion, both in terms of the financials for the Affordable Housing Project and with Zion Church to establish a long-term financial plan to take the church into the next decades on solid financial ground.
- -The Housing Summit Planning Committee has offered the Zion Affordable Housing Project and opportunity to speak at their summit in October.
