

A Message from the Zion Lutheran Council President:

As we turn the calendar to January of a new year, I am reminded of a verse from 2 Corinthians, 5:17, "When anyone is joined to Christ, he is a new being, the old is gone (namely 2024), the new has come" (2025). This verse certainly highlights Zion as we look forward to the new year.



We need to put the "old" behind us, taking satisfaction in many things: welcoming Jake Czarnik-Niemeyer back as our SAM (Synodical Approved Ministry) minister. He became Vicar Jake and we deeply thank him for his continued pastoral leadership; welcoming a number of new members into Zion's faith community and through the generous donation of Linda Wirtz, an upgraded sound system which enhances our worship experience in the sanctuary as well as for those who watch via U tube. More importantly we need to put aside our disappointments and frustrations such as having the developer with whom we had worked on our Affordable Housing Project declined to submit our project for essential funding.


Instead, we need to embrace the "new" for 2025. We will continue to pursue a number of alternatives for bringing the Affordable Housing Project (possibly on a reduced scale) to fruition. At the same time our Call Committee continues to explore the options for calling a new pastor such as sharing clergy with another faith community. There will be much hard work ahead of us as we develop a plan for when Appleton Bilingual School leaves in August. While the loss of that revenue is substantial "when anyone is joined to Christ"all things are possible. Your help, your prayers and support will enable Zion to meet these challenges and continue as a vibrant congregation whose mission extends beyond the church walls into our surrounding neighborhood. We have seen some of that mission taking place; our parsonage houses a non-profit artists' cooperative; our members and our neighbors shared Advent meals (thank you Lynn and Brianne for all your hard work to make these meals possible) and we hope to continue this during Lent; we look forward to offering a camping retreat to our youth in cooperation with Prince of Peace.



Jesus came to us as a baby born in a stable and yet He was the savior and bringing of eternal life to those who believe. The new year if often symbolized as a baby because like the new year, infants have endless possibilities. There are endless possibilities for Zion if we have the faith to pursue them.

Lynn Ann provided us with samples of booklets that they utilize at Linwood place. We will discuss with Karen working with a volunteer to create similar documents for Zion Mutual Homes and the church moving forward.

The approval of the agenda -motion was made and approved.

Approval of the October minutes -motion was made and approved.

The administrators report was reviewed. Karen was not present for any questions, some of the things on the report: FSM has moved into the parsonage as of October first, there are two bids for snow removal

Gwen from Property committee will follow up on the snow removal as we are expecting possible snow on Wednesday.

Lynn and Brianne started their roles as hospitality coordinator and Outreach Coordinator. We continue to have great volunteers on Mondays in the church office.

Vicar Jake's report was reviewed. He has several meetings with volunteers, Sue, office staff, as was as with others. planning the Thanksgiving Eve service, presided over the funeral of Vivian Schutte's funeral.

A committee reports, Zion Mutual Homes report was reviewed, looked at the recommendation for the increase in rent. At the beginning of the year. \$15 per month and \$5 per month for life lease residents. These figures were created based off of the 2.5% Raise of Social Security. This will be looked at on a yearly basis, motion was made to approve the increases in rent at this rate and was passed.

Finance report was reviewed. It was also discussed at this time for the Finance Committee to look at having regular meetings, old business, the affordable housing project. As discussed on Sunday, we were not chosen by the developers to present to WHEDA. We will continue to look at finding new ways to make up the shortfall. When the school leaves in August of 2025. We will still be looking at affordable housing; possibly a smaller project or projects with a smaller development team.

No new business at this time.

Our next meeting will be Monday, December 16, 2024; Devotion will be led by Vicar Jake.

We will now go into a closed session with Carrie Sanders and Bonnie Nusbaum.
