



A Message from the Zion Lutheran Council President:

In spite of yearly predictions from a hibernating rodent, March always brings a question mark. Will the month come roaring in like a lion or as meekly as a lamb. For Zion, too there will be questions and challenges ahead.

We had a successful annual meeting on February 9th at which time the congregation authorized our Call Committee, chaired by Deb Reis and Trisha Kasten, to update Zion's MSP (Ministry Site Profile) to call a full time pastor. Subsequently, they met on a zoom call with the Synod's representative, Asher O'Callaghan. He reiterated that there is a critical shortage of pastoral candidates so the search goes on and may require some adjustments to Zion's expectations. One note is that on Page 17 of the Annual report (under the financial report) there was a misprint. This has no affect on the church finances and a reprint of the corrected page will be made available in the near future.

At the February 17th Council meeting, Kandie Wilz was approved as the point person for our ongoing Affordable Housing Project. Our consultant, Bonnie Nussbaum, has taken a step back in order to concentrate more fully on community connections to support Zion's housing goals. Additionally, we continue to work with Carrie Sanders who is assisting us in formulating a financial plan for Zion's future while still keeping sight of our commitment to our mission of creating community.

The Worship & Music committee continues to plan for meaningful worship services with the assistance of our two wonderful supply pastors, Pastor Jan LaVake and Pastor Karen Jewell. A huge thank you to these ladies for their efforts on behalf of our congregation. Plans for the Lenten worship is well in hand. Ash Wednesday service will be at 6:30 on February 5th. Thereafter, worship will be at 6:30 each Wednesday, preceded by our Lenten soup suppers. Thanks to our outreach coordinators, Lynn Walter (Zion) and Brianne Connelly (neighborhood) for organizing these meals. Heather Watney, our Music Coordinator, is working to bring special music to various worship services in the months ahead. At the same time, we await Vicar Jake's return from the Sunshine State to join us for Palm Sunday and Holy Week.

I marvel at the way so many members step up to fill in where needed to keep Zion a vibrant faith community. It reminds me of the children's song, "All God's creatures have a place in the choir". We are all creatures (i.e. children) of God whether lion or lamb, tall or short, black or white and at Zion everyone has a welcoming place in the choir.
