As we look ahead in July, we will again celebrate "Christmas in July". As a part of that celebration, Jon Meyer and the Stewardship Committee has the following message:

Our Christmas in July Sunday is coming up on July 28th. The hymns and carols will remind us of the "cool" season (certainly opposite of heat and humidity!) and also of the sharing and gifting that takes place at that time. We will have the opportunity to make some gifts to Zion in the form of minor repairs and also to the community through gifts to the Blessing Box. The format will be similar to what we do at Christmastime with the gift envelopes on the tree for ABS and Columbus Schools. You may choose an envelope from the tree and bring that gift back to the church. For example, in the case of minor repairs, you might to choose to give the full amount of money right now or spread it out over the course of five months so that the task is completed by the real Christmas season. Zion Council Minutes

April minutes were reviewed, a motion was made to approve minutes and passed

Zion Place Report

John K. began the meeting by discussing the affordable housing project and report created by GLCI. There was an unintentional error in the GLCI report about the finances of Zion Place. This was discussed and clarified. Rent increases were discussed and the fears about large increases were discussed. Earlier this year there was a 25 dollar increase for the rent at Zion Place, this was the first rent increase in 10 years. Through the discussion it was agreed upon that the representatives of Z.P. will look at yearly rent increases to offset increased costs of utilities and running Z.P. as well as the increases with inflation. These increases will not be unreasonable amounts as it will still keep the housing affordable and considerably less than other rents across the Fox Cities. The rental structure of Z.P. was also discussed. There is one 1 bedroom and the rest are 2 bedroom apartments, the square footage is the same for all apartments. Each unit is \$620, there is a garage stall for each apartment which is \$30/month and those are all rented. There are 5 life leases yet and the money to be able to pay those out as needed is in a separate account. It was also discussed that there was a 60 person waiting list for the apartments. Fears were expressed about utilizing vouchers (section 8) and what that might entail. It was discussed that if the current structure is working then it will remain as is.

Also discussed was the elevator project that was coming up and the majority of it will be paid for by funds already available. Once the elevator is fixed Z.P. would be able to give a monthly amount of approximately \$2,500 back to help support the church.

Administrator Report

Karen reported on the many things that she is working on.

City of Appleton An inspector from the city came in to inspect the Parish house to give us the information we needed in order to rent that to provide an income for the church. It was said that a sprinkler system would need to be installed if we want to utilize the house for any type of housing where people would be sleeping overnight, and the doors on the bathrooms would need to be widened for wheelchair accessibility. New Voices This is a group that was looking to rent an office because they will be losing their current office space in a few months. Karen has not yet heard back from them. Ad to rent office space Karen discussed putting an ad out on Loop Net to inform other Non Profit organizations that we have this space for rent for offices. Again this would be a way to provide an income to support the church.

2 Lifts, Sanctuary and Chapel Initially it was mentioned that we would need to completely replace both lifts. The initial discussion with Gary Neuman was that it is because parts are not even available any more for these models of lifts. His thoughts were if we completely replaced the Sanctuary lift, he could utilize parts from the old one to fix the Chapel lift. That way we would save money at this time by not having to replace 2 lifts. Karen has since spoken to the lift company and they had mentioned that there is a great possibility that the parts needed for both could be fabricated to fix it.

May 29th from 4:30-5:30 there will be a kids block party

August 5-8 Missions Church downtown wanted to have their Arts Camp here and utilize the Fellowship Hall, Kitchen and possibly the gym.

Olson Solar- they were contacted to discuss the possibility of installing solar panels on Zion Mutual Homes and what that would look like for cost as well as benefit for the residents. If installed there would be no way to separate the common areas bill for the residents. Therefore, it would need to be included into the rent cost.

The East Central Synod gave \$1,000 for the Affordable Housing Project

Approximately \$1,600 was collected at our Good Friday service for the Affordable Housing Project.

An anonymous donor gave \$550 in the collection plate on Mother's Day. What a joy and generous gift!

The Finance report was reviewed

A motion was made and passed to send \$100 donation to the Synod for the conference that was attended by our two congregation members. This was the suggested donation amount so that will be mailed out to the Synod.

Linda Wirtz will step into the Zion Foundation Board, to help fill the spot where Chris Neuman had been a member. All of the Councils' thoughts and prayers go out to the Neuman family for the loss of Chris. Chris was a very important part of Zion for many years.

Important information:

-Developers are beginning to follow up with Bonnie regarding our Request for Proposals (RFP) and several have indicated they do plan to submit proposals.

-Karen Farlow, Church Administrator, has drafted a letter to be forwarded to area non-profits describing the parsonage and what exactly is for rent.

-WisconSibs is a local group which, for more than 20 years has been serving siblings and others who support people with disabilities along their lifelong journey through peer support programs, education and networking opportunities, leadership development, and more. Bonnie discussed with WisconSibs the difficulties inherent in finding housing for adults with disabilities and how the Zion housing project might be an ideal opportunity for those individuals and other disenfranchised people to find a community that is welcoming and supportive so they are able to live more independently.

-Kevin Englebert indicated the only time the County has been involved with funding housing was during the time they had ARPA funds which have been exhausted at this point. He gave Bonnie information on a potential expert in community kitchens which may be useful if the local business part of this project moves forward. He also shared potential funding opportunity through the Public Finance Authority for us to check out.

-Bonnie is on vacation from Sunday, June 16th to Friday, June 28th with limited access to email.
