There are also bright spots to highlight. Rally Sunday marked the beginning of a new Sunday School year under the direction of Pennie Reis and confirmation directed by Stephanie Draheim. Thanks for all the work you put into these vital programs of Christian education. It is also uplifting to hear the "voices" of our littlest members. While some may look upon this as a distraction, we need to remember Jesus's words in the gospel of Mark; "Let the children come to me, do not stop them, because the kingdom of God belongs to such as these". Instead let's welcome these little children to God's house and rejoice in hearing the voices of Zion's future.



Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes August 19, 2024

Approval of the Agenda: Motion was made and Approved

Approval of the Minutes: Motion was made and Approved for the July minutes

Administrators report: Discussion about renting the Parsonage to FSM (Fabricating Something More), a non-profit in Appleton. They work with Veterans and kids who have gone through trauma to name a few, and help them process through art. Motion made to rent the Parsonage pending Developer agreement. Bats were found in the belfry and also noticed in the sancturary and school. The Santurary lift is working, thank you Gary! He is now working on the lift by the Chapel.

Finance: Discussed using designated accounts Kingdom for Kids and Nursery to be used for the Sunday School. Motion was made and Approved Discussed the amount of money that is in the Checking account that is not earning that much interest. Recommendation from the credit union to move some of the money into the Savings account where it will earn more interest. This is looked at for Zion Mutural Homes (ZMH) to also put some of their money from the checking account into a money market account to accrue more interest

Welcome Sunday- sending a mailing out to get members and neighborhood members to come back.

Sept 9th there will be a Worship Survey. This will help direct the Worship committee in preparing for Sunday services

Affordable Housing Project Update

Team Meetings:

September 8th, Panel Presentation to Zion Congregation; September 9th, Roundtable Meeting; September 22nd, Zion congregation voting; September 23rd, Development and Planning Teams.

Important information:

- Our biggest news is that the Zion Congregation overwhelmingly voted to support the housing project! Those present last Sunday voted in favor of proceeding with the housing project and allowing the various Teams to proceed with their work on behalf of the project.

- More details were shared with regard to how the developers are conceiving of the project. This included a tentative proforma, timeline, and more. It is important to note that WHEDA has not yet released all of the necessary information for the developers to move forward with presenting our project, so we have to bide time until that happens.

- Appleton Town Makers will meet on October 9th. Zion Lutheran Church will be hosting the Town Makers meeting so we intend to use that opportunity to showcase our project in hopes of building some helpful collaborations among the people attending.

Upcoming Meetings:

Monday, October 14th, Roundtable Meeting, in person at Zion Lutheran Church in the Fellowship Hall at 4:30-6 pm. Anyone may attend to hear updates on the affordable housing project.

A Ministry Update on Zion Lutheran Church's Housing Project

Last year FELC's annual giving appeal included an initiative to support Zion Lutheran Church as they explored options to provide affordable housing. Bonnie Nussbaum was hired to work with a dedicated group of volunteers from the church. Recently, Vicar Jake Czarnik-Neimeyer came back to lead the congregation and support the work that has already taken place.

They have solicited input from the neighborhood, the city and members of the faith community. They have explored the financial viability of commercial space, intentional communities and daycares. I have been amazed at the willingness of the steering team to dig in and explore options, to research the availability of outside funding and to modify their vision as they dealt with the realities of grant proposals and the interest of developers. In mid-September, the congregation voted on a proposal to move forward with a developer who plans to build 75 units of housing by renovating the two schools, razing the parsonage and replacing it with a new building, and putting up a new three-story building on the same block as Zion Place*. Their hope is to have a proposal in to receive a loan from the Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development

Why are they working so hard? Because they have caught hold of a vision to be a church of Jesus Christ embedded in the community in a way that brings wholeness and life to many. They are determined to save and revive the church in a way that

makes it sustainable into the future and will give them an opportunity to share the grace and love of Jesus. There are still no guarantees that this particular project will be successful, but it is clear that there is a sense of excitement in doing something so meaningful. In September, First English was able to share with those at Zion \$5,000 toward their project. They are thankful for our willingness to be mutually supportive and not competitive - it is such a blessing to know that we share a mission to see faith in Jesus Christ last into the future.

I am so thankful to all of you at First English and your willingness to look beyond our walls and be a blessing to others. Thank you for joining together as "The grace of Jesus moves us to fearlessly join God in loving the world!"
